LEVELS

Beginner Level 1

Description: Learners know no English or very little.

Skills:

- Recognize basic vocabulary (e.g., numbers, colors, common objects).
 - Respond to yes/no questions (e.g., "Are you happy?").
 - Use simple phrases (e.g., greetings).
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Beginner Level 2

Description: Learners can engage in basic communication.

Skills:

- Answer simple questions about familiar topics (e.g., personal information, daily routines).
 - Formulate short, simple sentences.
 - Understand and use basic verbs in the present tense.
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Intermediate Level

Description: Learners can have simple conversations and express thoughts more clearly.

Skills:

- Discuss familiar topics in more detail (e.g., hobbies, interests).
 - Use a wider range of vocabulary and some past tense.
 - Start to articulate opinions and preferences (e.g., "I like.. because..").
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Advanced Level

Description: Learners can communicate effectively and understand complex ideas.

Skills:

- Engage in discussions on a variety of topics, including abstract concepts.
- Use advanced grammar structures (e.g., conditional sentences, passive voice).
- Express opinions, make arguments, and discuss cultural nuances.
- Understand and produce detailed texts, including essays and reports.
